

Total animal intake at the Bonnyville & District SPCA




125 adoptions37 dogs 4 cats reunited to their families.

Coming out of Covid has seen the number of animals at the shelter increase, and adoption rates decrease. Currently we are OVER capacity!

Hiring and retaining qualified staff has been a challenge.

To attract GOOD employees we need to offer competitive wages.

Sustainable funding from the Town and the MD is critical in keeping the Bonnyville & District SPCA's doors open to serve the community.

The Board of Directors is formally requesting \$60,000 per year as a long term commitment that we can count on.
