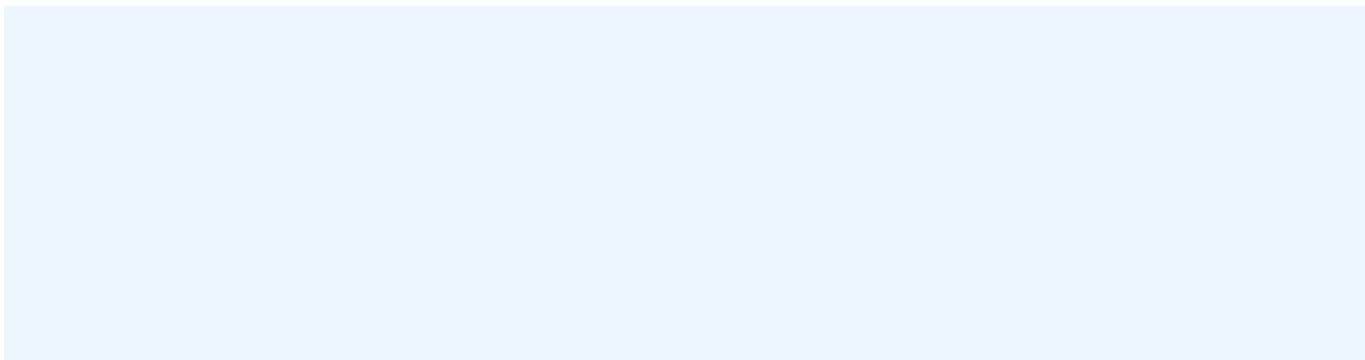

Police Officers: Of the eight established positions, seven officers are working. One officer is on special leave (One Other leave) and that position is backfilled to ensure coverage. There is one hard vacancy detected at this time.

Detachment Support: Of the three established positions, three resources are working. There is no vacancy detected at this time.
