APPENDIX C

Section 66 Work Camps

- All work camps, that are an accessory use to industrial or resource development, require a development permit.
- A temporary development permit for a work camp may be issued for up to one (1) year, at which time an application may be made for a continuance of the use for one (1) additional year, after which a new development permit approval is required.
- An application for a development permit for a work camp must provide the following information:
 - (a) the location, type, and purpose of the camp;
 - (b) adjacent land uses;
 - (c) the method of supplying water, and sewage and waste disposal to the camp. The proposed method of sewage disposal must comply with the Alberta Private Sewage Systems Standard of Practice (as amended from time to time) and be to the satisfaction of the Regional Health Authority;
 - (d) the number of persons proposed to live in the camp;
 - (e) demonstrate approval from Alberta Environmental Protection if the camp is located on Crown land;
 - (f) the start date for development, date of occupancy by residents, and removal date for the camp; and
 - (g) reclamation measures once the camp is no longer needed.
- 66.4 A work camp may be located within a hamlet boundary.
