  - c) the home business may not generate traffic uncharacteristic to the area;
  - d) all required parking must be on-site; and
  - e) outside storage of materials, goods or equipment on the site shall be directly related to the home business and, at the discretion of the Development Authority, may require screening or fencing.
- The display or placement of signs on the premises of a home business shall be restricted to one identification sign no larger than 1.0 square metre (10.76 square feet) in area, and may be indirectly illuminated.
- 3. Applicable building, electrical, gas, plumbing, and sewer permits are required as per the Alberta Safety Codes Act.
- 4. An Alberta Transportation permit is required.

  - c) Rear yard: 6.0 metres (19.7 feet)
- 2. Applicable electrical, gas, plumbing, and sewer permits are required as per Alberta Safety Codes Act.

- 3. Shall comply with Consolidated Public Safety Bylaw No. 1812 regarding noise and nuisance.
- 4. As per section 52 of the Land Use Bylaw No. 1667: Outdoor lighting shall be located so that rays of light:
  - a) are not directed at an adjacent site;
  - b) do not adversely affect an adjacent site; and,
  - c) do not adversely affect traffic safety.
- 5. The developer shall ensure that emergency vehicle access is not obstructed at any time.
- 6. Campground design and maintenance shall have regard to the FireSmart Guidebook for Community Protection as amended from time to time. Fire pits shall be approved by Bonnyville Regional Fire Authority.
