Bonnyville Community Adult Learning Program (CALP)

Operating out of the C2 Centre, the Bonnyville CALP is a staple of the Portage College Foundational Learning faculty. Some key updates for 2023/24 are:

1. Partnership with the Bonnyville Senior's Centre, focused on iPad sessions and digital support so seniors can use technology safely.


2. Growth in programming for neurodivergent adults, most non-readers or emergent readers. Participants have seen independence and employment skills.

3. Significant increase in English Language classes with six offered weekly, learners predominantly from Ukraine and Morocco. Ten requests for support on citizenship exams.

4. Two weekly basic digital skills classes are held for the general public, attendance is growing and programming is well-received
