Title: Public Hearing – Bylaw No. 1867 Road Closure, Cancellation and Sale

PROPOSAL & BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Part 7, Section 230 (1)(a) of the *Municipal Government Act*, before giving second reading to a proposed Road Closure, Cancellation and Sale bylaw, Council must hold a Public Hearing.

DISCUSSION

Bylaw No. 1867 for Provincial Road Allowance Closure, Cancel and Sale which would authorize the closure, cancellation, and sale of a portion of Provincial Road Allowance west of SW-33-60-3-W4M and 195 meters, more or less, south of the north boundary of SW-33-60-3-W4M.

The Applicant has applied to close, purchase, and consolidate the area into the 2.64 acre parcel located in the NW corner of the SW 33-60-3-W4M to allow for a suitable building envelope on the property.

Bylaw 1867 was given first reading by Council on May 14, 2024.

We received correspondence from a neighboring landowner, attached as Appendix B, requesting that all property lines be clearly marked during this process to avoid any confusion about the boundaries between adjacent properties.
