Statement

The Municipal District of Bonnyville (M.D.) is committed to medical service sustainability for all in our community today and into the future.

Purpose

The M.D. Municipal Scholarship Program was created to encourage students to consider a career as a Medical Doctor, Registered Nurse, or Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and will provide two \$2,500 awards annually to support post-secondary institution tuition costs.

Definitions

For the purposes of this policy:

- (1) "Applicant" means a member of the public that meets the criteria outlined within this policy;
- (2) "Chief Administrative Officer" (CAO) means the Chief Administrative Officer of the M.D. appointed by Council, or their delegate;
- (3) "Council" means the duly elected Council of the M.D.;
- (4) "Post-secondary Institution" means an accredited college, technical school, or university.

Policy

- (1) Guidelines:
 - (a) The applicant must be a graduating high school student or current postsecondary student pursuing a two-year, four-year, or graduate degree as a Medical Doctor, Registered Nurse, or a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.
 - (b) The applicant must be a resident of the M.D.
 - (c) The applicant may apply to the M.D. scholarship program once per year of study.
- (2) Applications must include the following documentation:
 - (a) An essay (300 500 words) demonstrating the student's interest in one of these medical fields as a career in rural Alberta, and their contributions to and knowledge of our rural community (e.g. volunteerism, clubs, farming, etc).
 - (b) A Reference Letter to demonstrate personal attributes. This can be from a teacher, employer or local community leader or other personal reference.
 - (c) Proof of full-time program enrollment: from the post-secondary institution.

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- (3) Applications must be submitted to the M.D. Planning & Community Services Department by June 30 May 30 of each year.
- (4) Applications will be reviewed by the CAO or designate and then provided to Council with an award recommendation for consideration and approval.
- (5) Preference will be given to:
 - (a) new applicants who have not received a scholarship in a previous year.
 - (b) applicants expressing a commitment to return and practice their area of study in the M.D. region.
- (6) Funding for the scholarship program is subject to annual budget availability.
