## Re: Peacetime Disaster Mutual Aid Agreement

On behalf of Cold Lake City Council, I would like to inform you that the City of Cold Lake is executing Section 4 of the Peacetime Disaster Mutual Aid Agreement, signed by the now-amalgamated towns of Cold Lake and Grand Centre on December 1, 1982, and effective as of September 1, 1983. Other signatories to this agreement include Her Majesty the Queen as represented by the Minister of National Defence, the Municipal District of Bonnyville, the Town of Bonnyville, and the Village of Glendon.

It is our understanding that this agreement is now defunct, having been superseded or rendered redundant by more recent mutual aid agreements. The City of Cold Lake is executing Section 4 to give its 90-day notice to exit the Peacetime Disaster Mutual Aid Agreement as a means to rationalize the agreements we have on file, and to ensure that our record keeping is current.

With more recent agreements ensuring appropriate mutual aid response having been put in place and maintained, it is our understanding that this action will have no impact on our region's continued dedication to providing for the safety of our residents. The City of Cold Lake remains committed to assisting our valued neighbours and friends wherever possible, as evidenced by the more recently established mutual aid agreements with the Department of National Defence and the Bonnyville Regional Fire Authority, among others.

## PEACETIME DISASTER MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT



BETWEEN

The Municipal District of Bonnyville No. 87; Town of Bonnyville;
Town of Cold Lake;
Town of Grand Centre;
Village of Glendon;
All Municipal Corporations located in the Province of Alberta;

AND

Her Majesty the Queen as represented by the Minister of National Defence for Canada.

WHEREAS the above named Municipalities and Her Majesty the Queen, as members of the Bonnyville Emergency Measures Unit, are already working together in the Emergency Measures Organization, Planning and Training; and

WHEREAS a Peacetime Disaster could affect any Municipality or Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake to such a degree that local municipal resources or military resources would be inadequate to cope with the situation; and

WHEREAS the above named Municipalities and Department of National Defence wish to make pre-arrangements for speedy emergency action in support of any one Municipality or the Department of National Defence in the group which may be affected or threatened by Peacetime Disaster and require assistance.

NOW THEREFORE, the above named Municipalities and Her Majesty the Queen as represented by the Minister of National Defence agree as follows:

- Any one of the parties to this agreement, if and when in need of help to combat a Peacetime Disaster, may request mutual aid from one or more of the other parties, subject to the following conditions:
  - (a) Any calls for aid must be made by an elected representative of the Municipality concerned or the Commanding Officer of CFB Cold Lake, and must be directed to an elected representative of the Municipality or the Commanding Officer of CFB Cold Lake, whose assistance is being sought.
  - (b) Request for mutual aid shall be restricted to fire-fighting equipment and fire-fighting employees owned by either the Municipality or the Department of National Defence.
  - (c) On receipt of a call for aid, whether general, or specific as to resources required, the extent to the assistance given, will be at the discretion of each responding authority, having regard to their own local situation at the time.

- (d) Any cost incurred in connection with the mobilization, movement and deployment of mutual aid resources, will be borne by the Municipality and/or CFB Cold Lake supplying these resources. Any other costs will be the financial responsibility of the authority receiving the aid.
- (e) The Municipality affected or CFB Cold Lake, threatened by the disaster and calling for mutual aid, will implement its Peacetime Disaster Plan and for the duration of the disaster operations, will assume direction and control over equipment and manpower contributed by other parties to this agreement.
- 2. This agreement will come into force on the Aday of September 1983, and will be reviewed yearly thereafter. At the time of review, changes or additions may be introduced by way of a rider which shall become part of the agreement upon ratification by all parties.
- That upon acceptance of this agreement by all parties concerned, the previous agreement dated March 1, 1971, is declared nul and void.
- 4. Any one of the participating Municipalities may withdraw from this agreement by giving 90 days notice of termination to the other parties. After the withdrawal of any party, the agreement shall continue in force between the remaining parties.

EXECUTED on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen by the signature of the Minister of National Defence for Canada.
