On behalf of the Bonnyville & District Family & Community Support Services (FCSS) Board, we formally request your support in ensuring continued representation from both municipalities at the annual Family & Community Support Services Association of Alberta (FCSSAA) Conference held in Edmonton.

Historically, the costs associated with sending all board members, including two elected officials and one community representative from each municipality, have been covered by the Bonnyville & District FCSS program budget. However, due to increasing fiscal pressures and our ongoing commitment to protect and prioritize community programming, we are finding it increasingly difficult to absorb these expenses without compromising services.


The estimated cost per person to attend the FCSSAA Conference is approximately \$1,525, covering:

• Conference registration: \$500

Hotel accommodations (2–3 nights): \$600

Travel expenses: \$350

Meals and per diem: \$75





This would amount to approximately \$4,575 per municipality annually for all three of your appointed board members.
